I'm happy to report that I completed <u>Return to the Nest</u>. I've added new images and rearranged the sequencing. As a reminder, this series is part of my 'latter life transitions' body of work - the photographs explore the home of Mary Brown, who is re-housing her adult son - as so many of our elders are asked to do. I've also continued to work on <u>The Dealership Wreck</u> and recently added new images to this series. This body of work explores some of the two thousand auto dealerships that closed down across the United States. These large buildings represent over 70 million square feet of empty commercial real estate. During recent visits to auto malls around California I've noticed some of the empty buildings are beginning to reopen as dealerships, some are being torn down, some repurposed, while others continue to sit empty. I've witnessed new dealerships in the midst of construction directly across the street from vacant dealerships. I wonder how long it will be before American society forgets that there was a year or two when thousands of dealerships quickly closed and untold workers lost their jobs. At a time when GM is emerging from bankruptcy and things are looking up (somewhat) for auto manufactures, I hope this series captures a glimpse of the hidden fragility of this iconic American industry.
